Sacrament of Matrimony

In accordance with the regulations of the Bishop of Arlington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for a



minimum of 3 months is required *before* preparation may begin. Living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time.

Sacrament of Baptism



Parish Registration and the Baptism class are required. Baptisms are held every Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. in the Church Baptistery. Please contact the parish secretary to register for the Baptism classes.

Plan to attend the classes before the birth of the child.

What does it mean to be an active Catholic?

Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating that they are parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. To receive such a letter, one must be registered in the parish for at least 3 months, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations. In a community as large as Our Lady of Hope, one means of verifying participation is through the use of parish offertory envelopes. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please at least note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

"Ask Your Pastor" - NEW FEATURE!

How should we observe fasting regulations on the vigil of a solemnity? I recently heard that after I have said evening prayer on the eve of a solemnity that I could now begin feasting. Why then





after I say evening prayer on a Thursday in Lent am I not bound to abstain from meat on that evening as I would on Friday?

In accordance with Jewish custom, the day ends at sunset, and the new day begins. Hence, the Jewish leaders wanted the bodies taken down from the cross before sunset and thereby before the beginning of the Sabbath. For this reason, the Church allows Vigil Masses, because Saturday evening really is Sunday.

Along these lines, on the eve of a Solemnity, like the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Liturgy of the Hours does have a special "vigil" vespers (evening prayer) prescribed for that Solemnity. Keep in mind there is also a vespers for the day. So that leads one to conclude, that we have to merge two customs: That for a Solemnity, including Sunday, at sunset the evening before, the Solemnity begins with vespers and lasts through the vespers of the actual day.

With that in mind, when a person is in a solemn season like Lent, we should never use in a rather rude and pagan way "feasting" or "let the partying begin." Rather, we should rejoice, and celebrate the great mystery of our faith.

Concerning Thursday-Friday, keep to the chronological understanding. I would suggest not being scrupulous, but rather after one's dinner on Thursday, begin preparing for the Friday abstinence.

Music Ministry

"Laetare" Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is named after today's Entrance Antiphon, *Laetare Jerusalem*, which will be sung by the choir at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. The full text is: "Rejoice, O Jerusalem, and gather round all you who love her; rejoice in gladness, after having been in sorrow; exult and be replenished with the consolation flowing from her motherly bosom." The communion antiphon offers a similar prayer of rejoicing in the midst of our Lenten Season: "Jerusalem, is built as a city, bonded in one together; it is there that the tribes go up to praise the Lord." The setting sung by the choir has been newly composed for today's Mass.

Lent is Here!

Stations of the Cross will be offered each Friday during Lent at 2:15 and 7:30 p.m. in the Church. Take time to participate in this venerable tradition of the Church and meditate on our Lord's sacrifice for our sins.

Confessions will be heard every Wednesday evening during Lent from 6:30-8 p.m. beginning February 29th.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

All through Lent, we will offer Adoration from after the Thursday, 8:30 a.m. Mass throughout the day and into the evening, ending at 6:45 a.m. on Friday. A Holy Hour will be offered and Confessions will be heard from 7-8 p.m. on Thursday evening. Adorers are needed, especially men to fill the late night, early morning hours! Please sign up in the narthex.

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence are as follows: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of penance observed by both fasting (only one full meal during the day) and abstinence from meat. All other Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence; we forgo the eating of meat to make ourselves conscious of our Lord's sacrifice of Himself for our sins. The law of fasting is binding for those who are 18 years old but not yet 60; the law of abstinence is binding for those 14 years of age and older.


