The Marian Tea Tradition at Our Lady of Hope

Oh, Mary, we crown thee...

For a number of years, one of our members would daydream and pray that the Ladies of Hope would figure out a way to host a large tea party and crowning in honor of our Blessed Virgin Mary. Out of the blue one day, her prayers were answered, and the logistics became very clear. During the LOH Board's 2010-2011 summer planning meetings, the idea of a Marian Tea which would culminate with a May Crowning was presented, discussed and approved. Next, Peggy Kearney, who was President at this time, and Trish Daquano shared the idea with our Pastor, Fr. William Saunders, who was very happy and supportive about this endeavor.



The Board decided that May would be the best month to host this event, and a committee was formed. There were many eager hostesses for this first Marian Tea, and this spirit has continued every year since then. Ladies from ages 3 to 103 were invited to attend, dressed in their finest Sunday attire. Approximately 65 people attended our first Marian Tea and May Crowning which was held on Saturday, May 14, 2011. Our honored guests during the inaugural tea were Fr. Saunders, and Fr. Kevin Fimian, the Parochial Vicar.

Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary has always been the theme of these teas – she is front and center. This year and every year, Fr. Saunders has given us permission to display the parish's large Blessed Mother and Baby Jesus statue on a large round table in front of the Parish Hall crucifix. This table is reverently decorated with the theme colors, and attendees are invited to bring flowers to fill vases surrounding the statue. While processing, the ladies are led in Marian songs and praise by Suzanne Yerks, pianist and OLOH Choir Director, and Sabine Morson, vocalist, while a lovely floral crown, made by Kathleen Strawhacker, is placed on Mary's head.

Each year a number of ladies graciously volunteer to host a table during the Marian Tea and transfer the Parish Hall into a pretty floral tea room. Tables are adorned with personal statues of Mary, linens in the year's colors—this year's were pink and green--and the hostess's tableware, all mirroring love and devotion to our Blessed Mother. (It is amazing how just "the right" table linen, floral design, dishes, and baskets just seem to show up at Mary Linzmeyer's home, and she shares them us!)



On every table are Marian programs, also designed by Kathleen Strawhacker, and prayer

cards provided by the Legion of Mary and OLOH gift shop. For this year's Tea, each table also had a card describing one of the Marian parishes within the Diocese of Arlington. These pretty and descriptive cards were made by Deborah Baird, Lily Santiago, Marilyn Mahieu, and Kathleen Strawhacker.



No one leaves the Marian Tea being hungry! Many different types of delicious sandwiches, fresh veggies and fruit, cookies, pastries, and varieties of tea are served on beautifully decorated food and tea service tables. For the past two years, we have been so blessed to be able to use Della Droddy's elegant German samovars to heat water for the tea.

Young ladies are also a vital part of the tea. Each year, these fine teens are recruited by Viviane Castaneda, who is an expert with the servers' brigade. What would we do without their assistance and energy? It is such a treat to chat with these sweet girls.

During the tea, time is carved out to allow hostesses to share why their special Marian statue is cherished, and these testimonies are moving. Listening to how Our Blessed Mother has interceded for so many of our sisters in Christ is touching and God sent.

A tea wouldn't be complete without door prizes, and this year we had a generous supply of donated items. Sherry Grasson, the parish Gift Shop Manager, selected appropriate religious books, and Donna Bongiovanni, an expert embroiderer, donated a framed picture of Blessed Mother Teresa that she crafted. Adorning the prize table were tea pots donated by Eileen Quigley. Laura Thompson surprised us with a hand-crocheted afghan and oil painting as a raffle prize. In past years, Angelina Crew and Viviane Casta-

neda have painted flower pots. This year, too, Birthright in Leesburg benefitted from the proceeds of the raffle. It is a joy to witness the artistry by our generous ladies and to know that each door prize goes to a loving home.





May 17, 2014, was the fourth annual Marian Tea with 104 ladies in atten-

dance. Each year we welcome more guests with some tables having three generations of sisters in Christ! For some, it will become a yearly tradition as one of this year's hostesses, Pat Garman and her lovely granddaughter Brittany, would attest. Ladies look forward to attending each year because the

May Crowning evokes fond memories of this event when they were young. Each of us, no doubt, enjoys this special opportunity to honor Our Blessed Mother in a relaxing afternoon of sharing fellowship, prayer, song, and bountiful fare.

The Marian Teas have been possible with Our Blessed Mother's intercession, Fr. Saunders' support and that of his staff, and the talent and time of numerous ladies. Only some

of the volunteers' names are mentioned, but there are so many others, including men, who bring the Marian Tea to fruition each year. It is truly a labor of Marian love.



I hope and pray that it is God's will that what began as a onetime event will become yearly fixture for our parish. Perhaps you will join us in May 2015, for the fifth annual Marian Tea and May Crowning? I look forward to seeing you there!

In October, Birthright of Loudoun County will be celebrating their fortieth anniversary of assistance to mothers and little ones in Loudoun County and the surrounding area. The office in Leesburg has been in several locations over the past 40 years and is now located at 823 South King Street, Suite I. Birthright services are available to any woman with a problem stemming from pregnancy or complicated by it. Whatever the background or need, Birthright can help. No judgments are made, and all information is confidential. Birthright relies solely on the private donations of individuals, churches, and groups for its operation. Our Lady of Hope Catholic Church has been a regular and generous benefactor of the Birthright office since 2001.

In celebration of this milestone anniversary, two events sponsored by the Knights of Columbus are being planned at our own Our Lady of Hope parish. The first date is October 5, when we will be asking parishioners to take home empty plastic baby bottles to fill with change - or cash or checks - to benefit Birthright. And on October 25, we will have a fun-filled evening of Bingo for Birthright with all proceeds going to help the mothers and babies in need. OLOH is also planning a car wash fundraiser in the spring of 2015. This year, Birthright will be increasing its after school hours and its social media presence, and the support from these events will help further these needs of the Birthright office.
