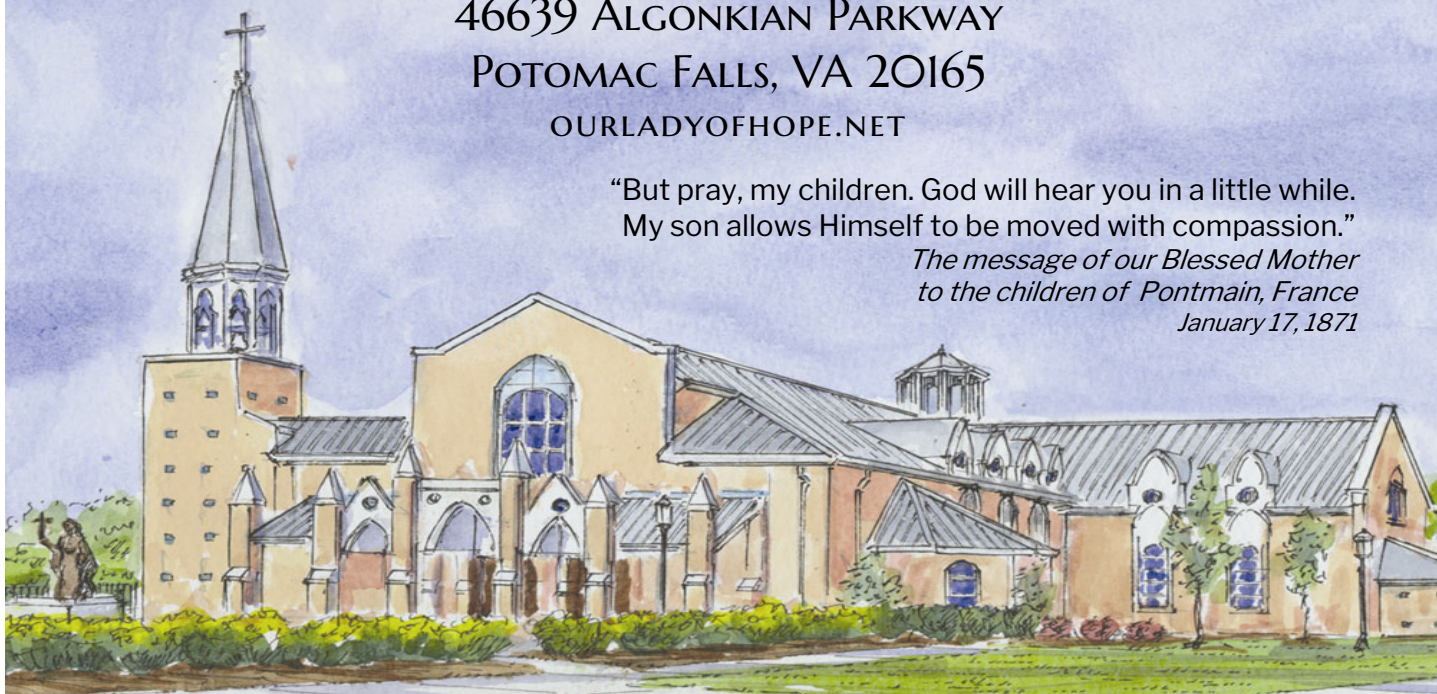

## PARISH INFORMATION

**What does it mean to be an active Catholic?** Those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized, or have a letter signed to serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism should be parishioners and active, practicing Catholics. ***To be considered active, one must have been registered in the parish for at least three months, attend Mass regularly, and be committed to a stewardship of time, talent, and treasure.*** We encourage all parishioners to become active in one of the parish organizations.

In a community as large as Our Lady of Hope, our most effective means of verifying active participation is through the use of parish offertory envelopes or electronic giving, such as Faith Direct. If you choose not to participate in the support of the parish, or are unable to contribute at this time, please note your prayerful support on your envelope and place it in the weekly offertory. We will then be aware of your continued participation, and you will not be noted as "inactive" on our parish roster.

## PREPARING FOR SACRAMENTS

**Baptism & Baptism Class:** Baptisms are held on Sundays at 1:30 p.m. The baptism class for parents is held one Saturday a month at 11:00 a.m. Please call the Parish Secretary to pre-register for the next available class.

**Sacrament of Matrimony:** In accordance with the regulations of the Bishop of Arlington, couples must contact a priest and begin preparation at least six months prior to the wedding. Parish registration and active participation for a minimum of three months is required *before* preparation may begin. Couples who are living together will be asked to live separately during the preparation time as living together before marriage is sinful and harmful to the future marriage.

**First Communion: For Children:** Generally, First Communion is received when a child is in second grade. Preparation for First Communion is a two year process, and students must complete both first and second grade classes before receiving Holy Communion. Please contact the Religious Education Office with questions.

**Sacramental Preparation for Adults (RCIA):** Adults who wish to receive Baptism, First Communion, and/or Confirmation are invited to attend the Inquiry Class on Thursday evenings. Please contact the Parish Secretary or visit the website to register.

## RESPECT LIFE MONTH

October is Respect Life Month, and today (October 4) is Respect Life Sunday. Each year at this time, the bishops of the United States call us to pause and reflect more deeply on the sacred gift of human life and our role in welcoming, cherishing, and protecting the lives of our brothers and sisters. This year we're also celebrating the 25th anniversary of Pope Saint John Paul II's encyclical *The Gospel of Life* (*Evangelium vitae*). Our Holy Father wrote this document to reaffirm and present the Church's joyful teaching on human life within the context of modern times, and it remains relevant today. This year's theme is appropriately, "Live the Gospel of Life."

What does it mean to live the Gospel of life? In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40). In other words, as Saint John Paul II reminds us, Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87).

During this Respect Life Month, ask Jesus how he is specifically calling you to follow in his footsteps. How is he calling you to care for the lives of your neighbors, especially those who are most vulnerable? Let us continue, *by prayer and petition, to make our requests known to God* (Second Reading). As the Second Reading encourages us: *Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me*. Let us ask the Lord for an outpouring of grace, especially the graces of wisdom, humility, and courage, as well as open and generous hearts, that we may respond to his call to *Live the Gospel of Life*.

Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times." Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: *The stone that the builders rejected / has become the cornerstone; / by the Lord has this been done, / and it is wonderful in our eyes?* / Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

WHERE FAMILIES LEARN, PRAY, & GROW TOGETHER

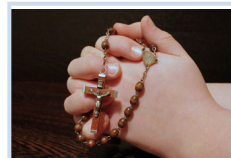
Let's face it. Raising a family in the Faith can be challenging at time. We need the support of the Church and other families to inspire, encourage, and raise holy families.

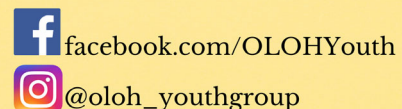

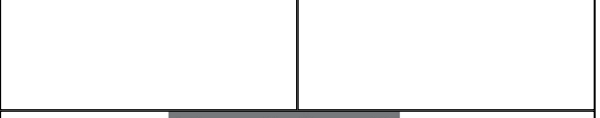
