Anointing of the Sick gives spiritual healing and graces to help a person accept illness, prepare for surgery, or prepare for death

Baptism washes away original and all sin, fills the soul with sanctifying grace, and makes us children of God and members of the Church

Holy Communion is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ Reconciliation (also known as Confession or Penance) forgives sins committed after baptism, even mortal sins

Holy Orders gives the power and grace to men to perform the sacred duties of bishops, priests, and deacons Confirmation increases our strength to profess, defend, and spread the faith as adults with the gifts of the Holy Spirit
