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| <p>Have no food or drink (except for water or medicine) for one hour before Holy Communion</p> | <p>With reverence for God in the way that we act and dress</p> |
| <p>“Food for the journey”: someone’s last reception of Holy Communion before death</p> | <p>Yes</p> |
| <p>So that the faithful may adore it and receive it in Communion</p> | <p>Yes</p> |
