Parish Service Partnership

We are all so blessed to have such a vibrant parish on which to center our lives, and I know I'm not alone in that sentiment. It is with that thought, that I am making a direct appeal to the Ladies of Hope to volunteer for Parish Service Partnership, because I know many of you personally and I know your wonderful hearts! It doesn't have to be a big draw on anyone's time, but a little can go a long way. We're losing one of our biggest contributors to PSP in January, and this will leave a big gap for the service this parish hopes to provide. I hope you will all prayerfully consider this request.

We need a few more cooks as most of our requests are for meal assistance when the family has a hospitalization or a new baby to manage. We shoot for easy casseroles and some of our cooks make ahead and freeze to fit their own schedules. If you can cook but delivery is an issue, we can try to team up. We also try to provide a small, healthy breakfast casserole for our Priests on Sundays to get them through all the Masses.

We also need a few people who can offer rides. For instance, we have a request right now for a senior couple in the parish who give a lot of their time, talent, and treasure to the parish, but who have now hit their own snag. One of the couple does all the driving - especially with the husband to all the doctor appointments and she, too, now has her own flurry of competing doctor appointments to manage. Offering a ride to this couple to a local doctor appointment would be such a great burden of their shoulders and should be a fairly manageable task if your schedule permits. And don't be afraid to ask your husbands!

You need not commit to any particular request in advance. PSP will send up a SignUp Genius Request if it's for meals and a regular email for other more detailed requests such as rides. You only need to respond to those for which you are available and let the others pass.
